- > CRR Revisions
  - > Align with new federal regulations regarding research misconduct
  - > To be presented to Board of Curators in September
  - > S&T will need to make minor modifications to Bylaw to better harmonize with the regulations with respect to forming an investigation panel but can work with current Bylaws
- Digital accessibility policy
  - New federal regulations (Title II) requiring accessibility Developing strategy.
  - Websites, apps, online materials need to be accessible.
  - Employing software to check accessibility such as Udolt.
  - Exceptions for old content that is not being used and third party content.
- ➤ DEI restructuring at all campuses

- Academic Affairs Policy Updates
  - New program proposals process consolidating steps to reduce overall time
    - Some discussion about the tools available for market analysis no one size fits all identifying career options
  - > CRR process Board of Curators or President establish and revise CRRs
    - ➤ Impetus can come from any campus need a consistent person (project manager) on each campus to move it forward. All approvals need to be in place before coming to Academic Affairs
    - ➤ All CRRs affecting faculty go to each campus faculty leadership group before going forward.



#### IFC Retreat 8/5/24 - 8/6/24, Columbia, MO\_



- Missouri Online
  - Each campus now responsible for their own marketing or online learning and budgets are moving to the campuses (i.e. Missouri online is no longer billing the campuses resources that went to Missouri Online are now available on the campus)
- ➤ Missouri Online not going away, Missouri Online will still offer **some** professional development. Online teaching certification as well as course certification every 5 years, or when major changes to a course occur is **being done here at S&T by CAFÉ**.
- New Canvas Tools
  - UdoIt to check accessibility and makes fixes or provides instructions to make fixes. Aligns with coming requirements.
  - Honor Lock for online proctoring. Uses online AI and alerts a "real person"
  - Ongoing pilots Harmonize (discussion board), Critic (peer to peer peer review).

- Collaborative and participatory decision-making involving <u>faculty</u>, administrators, staff, and students, in shaping policies, procedures, and direction of Missouri S&T.
- > Faculty Role
- Curriculum, subject matter and instruction, and research.

- Faculty should have a role in decision-making in areas such as longterm budgeting, and the selection and evaluation of administrators.
