3.Report on email situation

Email status: As reported by Dan Uetrecht

We are in the process of ordering a Dell Equalogic SAN to replace the Dell EMC SAN having the performance issues. We anticipate delivery in 3 weeks from order placement and we have 30 days from delivery to implement and return the old SAN equipment.

SAN equipment details:

Dell/EMC SAN to be returned 20TB storage, 2 storage processors, 300MB usable

cache

New Dell/Equallogic SAN 36TB storage, 6 storage processors, 2700MB usable

cache

Last year we originally looked at a similar Equallogic SAN and decided in favor of the Dell/EMC SAN due to cost. The Equallogic SAN at the time was \$6.49/GB. We have

negotiated the replacement deal at \$1.98/GB. Dell is refunding our entire purchase price of the original SAN plus cash credits against the new equipment to obtain this price model.

When the new SAN is installed and tested we will begin an email migration. There will be no long extended outage but rather short (10 minute) periods of time where an individual's mailbox will be moved to the new SAN storage. We very much want to get this in place prior to the end of the semester so we have a real loading experience with the students on campus.
