Computer Security needs to continually be on the front burner. There was a major incident recently at Oak Ridge National Labs that compromised social security numbers of all visitors from 1996-2004. "Only the paranoid survive" needs to be our motto. This will be an important topic for the retreat as well.

Barry Flashbart---Why are we losing the umr.edu domain so quickly?

Answer: These domain names are controlled by Educause. You can't just buy them like you can with a .com domain. Normally the duration to keep an old one is 6 months and we had negotiated for 18 months for all changes. We've already used up much of that for the transition this year. University of Minnesota-Rochester is interested in the UMR logo.
